BUREAU OF JUSTICE ASSISTANCE INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY ENFORCEMENT PROGRAM (IPEP) PERFORMANCE MEASURES

In the following pages, you will find the performance measures for the Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA) Intellectual Property Enforcement Program (IPEP). These measures are designed to gather information on grant activity that is related to the primary objectives of the IPEP:

Establish task forces to conduct investigations and forensic analyses of evidence and prosecutions in matters involving criminal intellectual property laws.

Enforce criminal intellectual property law.

Acquire computers and other equipment to conduct investigations and forensic analyses of evidence in matters involving criminal intellectual property laws.

Provide education and awareness to the public.

Build capacity of law enforcement agencies and task forces by attending and/or delivering specific training(s) related to intellectual property enforcement.

There are two types of performance measures: quantitative (numeric) and qualitative (narrative responses). The quantitative data are entered in the BJA Performance Measurement Tool (PMT) every 3 months, referred to as a reporting period. Thereafter, data entry will occur quarterly, with a 30-day submission period following the close of the reporting period.

In addition, grantees are required to respond to open-ended qualitative narrative questions in January and July of each calendar year based on activities that occurred during the previous 6-month period.

In January and July of each calendar year and at the close of the award, the grantee (or direct recipient of funds from BJA) is responsible for creating a *Report* from the PMT to upload into the JustGrants System. During the non-submission periods, you are encouraged to create a report for your records.
